- 7. What happens after a new pope is elected? he presents himself to the people from a balcony overlooking St. peter's Square and gives his first blessing to Rome and the world
- 8. Where do Catholics wait in order to see the new pope? St Peter's Square
- 9. How long does a person remain pope? for his remaining life; until he dies
- 10. Who is the current pope? Where does he come from? Pope Francis from Argentina
